

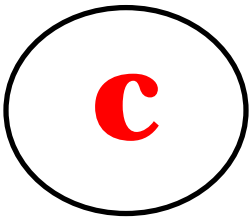

### Forensic Interviewing

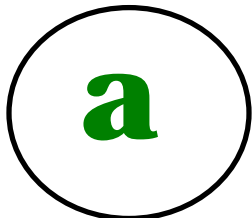
The Child Abuse Network provides many services to the community including forensic interviewing. The forensic interviewer is a child specialist who has been trained in child development, trauma impact on children, child abuse dynamics, and specialized interviewing techniques. This training allows the interviewer to conduct an interview, at the request of an investigator that is compatible with our legal system and sensitive to the needs of the child.

I am constantly amazed at the resiliency of children. Many children live through horrific experiences with a profound ability to cope. Unfortunately, some children struggle a lifetime with chronic mental health disorders. Due to the nature of what many of these children experience, I am continually astonished that all of these children don't suffer terrible long-term effects.

I am also fascinated by the way children describe their experiences. Unlike most adults, they have not been "trained" by society to build up their defenses and filter what they say. For instance, after a four-year-old girl finished recounting her experience to me during an interview, I tried to excuse myself. I told the child that I was going to step out of the room for a minute to speak to the investigator. I asked the child if she was ok and she shook her head back and forth and said, "I don't think it's a good idea to leave a kid alone in this room." She was absolutely right.

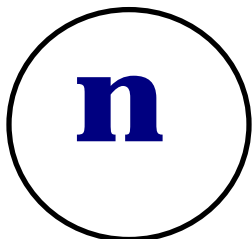

Anyone who works around children has observed that children see the world differently than adults. What may be important to adults is not necessarily important to a child. For example, when an adult asks a child to get dressed for the day, the child may put on a long sleeved sweater, shorts and mismatched socks. The child completed the task they were given; yet the final result is not what the adult wanted. A forensic interviewer is trained to communicate with children in a way they understand. How we ask the questions is as important as what children tell us.

Children also tend to be very sensitive to their own needs and the needs of others. In another interview I asked a 4 yr old girl to tell me what happened to her. She said, "Ok, but this will be sad. Do you want to hold my doll?"



Forensic Interviewing has evolved because children are often held to a higher standard of credibility than adults. In an effort to meet the demands of the "burden of proof" in our legal system, we have also attempted to meet the therapeutic needs of children. The Child Abuse Network is first and foremost committed to meeting the needs of the children.

In our last newsletter, I wrote about our Board Chairman, David Holden, who was about to receive the Tulsa People Volunteer of the Year – Leadership Award. This quarter I have the great honor to write about another remarkable individual who is associated with the Child Abuse Network – Penny Grant, MD.

Dr. Grant and her husband, Lee Cohen, moved to Tulsa in 1999 in order to join the Center’s medical team. In particular, she was interested in the partnerships we had developed and was intrigued as to the challenges that a community based child abuse response system would offer. It did not take her long to find her personal niche and career challenge – drug endangered children.


Thanks to the co-location of the Tulsa Police Department’s Child Crisis Unit and the energy of Detective Danielle Bishop, Dr. Grant was quickly involved in the problems of children who have been exposed to drugs. From news accounts one knows what a growing concern this is, but what we don’t know, the long term effects of drug exposure, is even more alarming.

In just a few short years, Dr. Grant has immersed herself in the issues of drug-endangered children and become nationally renowned for her work. She is on the National Drug Endangered Children Alliance Committee and is chair of its Medical Child Evaluation subcommittee. She is the local Principal Investigator of the Infant Development, Environment and Lifestyle (IDEAL) Study, a multi-site longitudinal development study funded through the National Institute of Health (NIH). She is one of the few certified examiners in the nation for substance-exposed infants neurobehavioral exams. I could go on and on, but it would take several more issues.

Thanks to the dedicated staff at the Center, CAN is an invaluable resource for the region. Thanks to the team approach at CAN, we challenge each other to look beyond the immediate.

Thanks to individuals such as Penny Grant CAN is beginning to achieve national recognition.
